The next Alumni Day is planned for 2020 at Campus Rheinbach and will take place as part of the university's 25th anniversary celebrations.



Cyber Security - Where Is it Going?

Cyber Security is a big issue at H-BRS. In 2017, Fraunhofer FKIE and H-BRS opened the joint Cyber Security Learning Laboratory "High Security and Emergency Response" on the Sankt Augustin campus. Here, specialists and managers from industry and public authorities can receive compact trainings in the fields of detection, analysis and reaction to cyber security incidents. H-BRS also participates in the newly founded Cyber-Security-Cluster Bonn which aims to become "the heart of cyber security in Europe.". The planned 'Cyber Security Tech Summit' is to attract around 3,000 experts to Bonn in March 2019.




Researchers of H-BRS Contribute to More Safety in Rail Transport and Cargo Control

As part of the Franco-German RE(H)STRAIN project, scientists of the Institute of Safety and Security Research (ISF) have developed an airlock for ICE and TGV that enables the non-contact detection of volatile substances originating from explosives or drugs at railway stations or train doors.

Researchers of the ISF and of the Institute for Detection Technologies (IDT) finished their research within the framework of European project C-BORD. In 2018 they tested new security technologies for improved cargo control in harbours at external borders of the European Union.
